In-Person Voting: Monday, October 7, 2024	When voting at the polls in Louisiana on Election Day, you are required to present a valid photo ID. Accepted forms of identification include a Louisiana driver's license, a Louisiana special ID card, or any other generally recognized photo ID that includes your name and signature (Louisiana R.S. 18:562(A)). If you do not have ID, you can still vote by signing a voter affidavit.
Absentee or Mail-in Voting Deadline	Louisiana voters may request a mail-in ballot (absentee) up to 7 days before Election Day. To qualify for absentee voting, voters must meet specific criteria, such as being over 65, temporarily absent from the state, or have a disability that prevents in-person voting. You can request a mail-in ballot online via the Louisiana Secretary of State's website or by contacting your parish Registrar of Voters office. Mail-in ballots must be received by 4:30 p.m. on November 4, 2024, the day before Election Day.
Early Voting	In Louisiana, early voting takes place from October 21 to October 28, 2024 (excluding Sunday). Voters can cast their ballots at their parish Registrar of Voters office or designated early voting locations. Early voting hours are typically from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
